**ZEPH WRITES, AFTER THEIR RETURN, SEPTEMBER 2014**

▶ Zeph has been thinking how to keep the people who are being saved in church and not falling away, as so many do (as we know!!). God spoke to Zeph about how to make disciples for Jesus. He is training up 10 people for 4 months, and then these will disciple and train 10 more people up themselves. Zeph says he will show us when we are next in Dodoma....

▶ The people attending early morning prayers (5-6am) are increasing and the Children's overnight prayer meeting is also: over 40 children came to Zeph's house to thank God for his safe return from UK and to pray for him!

▶ Zeph wanted to tell us **a story of a laptop**. When we take some second-hand laptops out to Tanzania, he gives them to people who have problems because of no computer. However he felt that he should keep one back as the Holy Spirit had not told him who to give it to.

Every time he went to give the laptop to someone, his spirit said no, yet it pained him to see the laptop at home unused. "Two weeks ago I visited a pastor who had trouble with his computer, which he had used for many years and now was useless. He showed me over 80 books, that he had written by hand, in order to help the church in Tanzania.

My heart told me to give the remaining laptop to him.

So I asked him to visit me a week later. When he arrived, I told him that God has given him the laptop. He cried a lot. He is 63, but to look at him, you would think he is a much younger man.

Afterwards he told me that he had come to our church the week before we left for UK. While he was there the Holy Spirit told him that I (Zeph) would help him cross over his troubles, but he did not understand. When I gave him the laptop, the Holy Spirit reminded him of this."

So Zeph was the bridge across.

We thank God that we have been part of this bridge, and the pastor has already started word-processing the books. He has already word processed a Bible Commentary... that is amazing.
